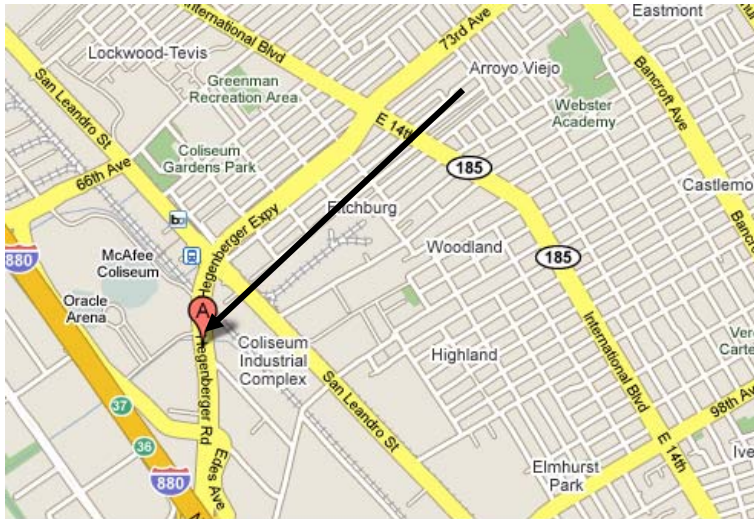

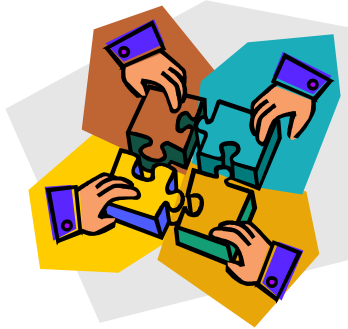

Alameda County's Independent Living Skills Program provides classes, training and activities to support successful transitions into adult life for eligible youth currently living in foster homes and group homes.

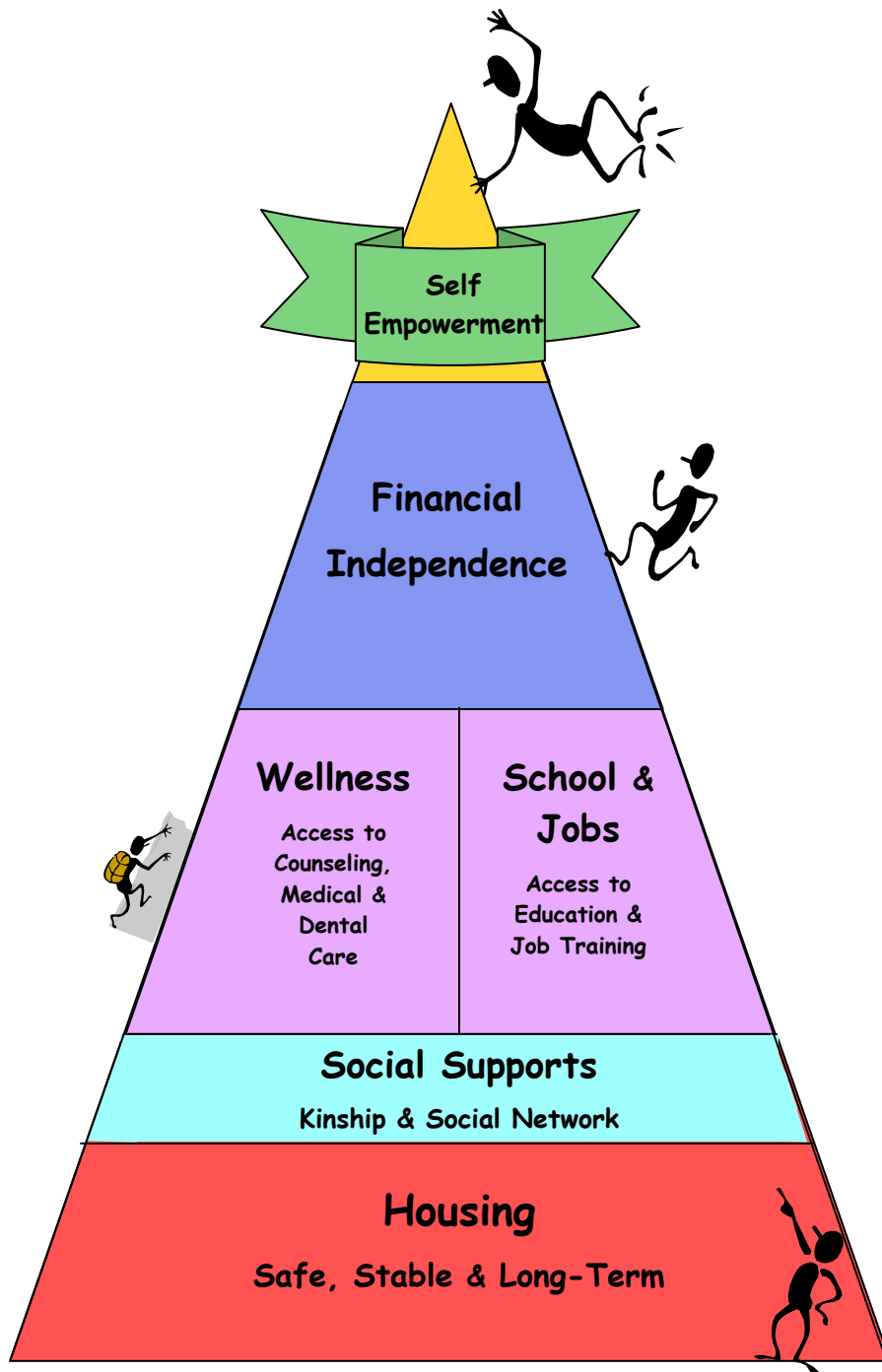

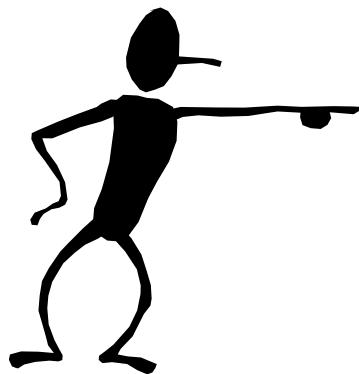
